

## **New York State Office of General Services**

### **Passenger Cars**

#### **Covered Products:**

This category shall cover on-road passenger cars classified as mini, compact cars, subcompact cars, small station wagons, midsized cars, midsized station wagons, and large cars.

#### **Definition:**

Fuel economy in automobiles is the amount of fuel required to move vehicles over a given distance.

#### **Standard for non-alternative fueled vehicles:**

All affected state entities shall purchase or lease vehicles which have a fuel economy in the top 30% of their vehicle class as listed under EPA size class on the U.S. Department of Energy's Office of Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency maintained web site <http://www.fueleconomy.gov/feg/byEPAclass.htm>  
Agencies should sort by city or highway mileage based on intended vehicle usage.

#### **Standard for alternative fueled vehicles:**

When affected state entities are purchasing or leasing alternative fueled vehicles, including acquisitions to comply with Executive Order 111 or EPAct, they are encouraged to select vehicles which have a fuel economy in the top 30% of their vehicle class as listed under EPA size class on the U.S. Department of Energy's Office of Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency maintained web site <http://www.fueleconomy.gov/feg/byEPAclass.htm>  
Agencies should sort by city or highway mileage based on intended vehicle usage.
