OGS TO AUCTION 2014 MASERATI AND BMW ON NOVEMBER 2 IN ALBANY

Vehicles seized by Attorney General

The New York State Office of General Services has added a 2014 Maserati Gran Turismo and a 2014 BMW X6 to the list of items the public can bid on at a surplus vehicle, highway equipment, and miscellaneous property auction scheduled to start at 9:30 a.m. Wednesday, November 2 at the Harriman State Office Building Campus in Albany. Items being sold will be available for inspection starting at 8 a.m. on the day of the auction.

The Maserati, with approximately 1,600 miles on its odometer, and the BMW, with approximately 5,400 miles on it, were seized by the Attorney General's Office in 2014 following an investigation into a \$9.9 million Medicaid fraud case in the Bronx. Proceeds from the sale of the two cars will be transferred to the Attorney General's Medicaid Fraud Unit.

This isn't the first time OGS has sold seized items. Last year, a 2013 Mercedes-Benz G63 AMG and a 2012 Audi A7 Prestige Quattro that were seized in 2013 following an investigation into a \$3.2 million Medicaid fraud case in Brooklyn were sold at a state surplus vehicle auction in Albany. In the summer of 2014, several pieces of men's jewelry and a Rolex were sold on the NYSStore.com eBay site after they were confiscated from a suspected drug trafficker on Staten Island. Later that year, a 1971 Camaro that was reported stolen in 1976 and was seized by New York State was among vehicles sold at a state surplus vehicle auction in Poughkeepsie.
