Overview of MAS

❑ What is a Multiple Award Schedule (MAS)?

- A 5-year Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contract with 3 five-year options (up to 20-year contract)
- A grouping of IDIQ contracts that fit into the same commodity and service group
- Also referred to as a GSA Schedule or a Federal Supply Schedule (FSS)

❑ How is a Schedule awarded?

- It is a negotiated contract based on evaluation criteria of fair and reasonable pricing, financial responsibility, past performance, and past experience

Example Schedule

- ❑ A GSA Schedule is a grouping of Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contracts for similar commercial products and service offerings.

IT Schedule 70 Special Item Numbers (SIN)

A SIN is a categorization method that groups similar products, services, and solutions together to aid in the acquisition process. These SINs cover the most common general purpose commercial IT hardware, software, services, and solutions.

Schedule Pricing

- ❑ Spot Reductions
- ❑ The prices you see on *GSA Advantage!* are CEILING PRICES.
- ❑ Industrial Funding Fee (IFF):
 - The price of supplies and services available to state/local entities will include the .75% IFF to cover the administrative costs incurred to operate MAS.
 - The price you are quoted is the price you pay.



Benefits of Using GSA Schedule Contracts

- ❑ Pre-competited, on demand contracts to increase the productivity and capacity of scarce acquisition resources.
- ❑ Awarding task orders against existing contracts minimizes lead times
- ❑ Exceptionally qualified vendors that are fully vetted to ensure they are able to do business with the federal government and state and local agencies.
- ❑ Competitive market-based pricing with the ability to negotiate further discounts at the order level



Ordering and Terms and Conditions

- ❑ No Federal mandated ordering procedures; use the Federal procedures as a guideline to ensure competition and best value
- ❑ Additional terms and conditions are allowed as long as they do not conflict with Schedule terms and conditions
- ❑ All contracts and BPAs established through Schedules should include the GSA Schedule Number
- ❑ Local Preference:
 - GSA eLibrary lists all contracts available



Funding for State and Local

- ❑ Receiving Federal grant funds does not:
 - Make otherwise ineligible activities eligible to purchase under Schedules, nor
 - Allow access to Schedules outside of approved programs.

- ❑ The current S&L programs, excluding the Public Health Emergency (PHE) authority which is limited to Federal grant funds, allow for use of all sources of funding

- ❑ When purchasing with grant funds, you **MUST** follow all grant requirements, including competition requirements



Schedule Ordering (FAR 8.405-2)

Up To Micropurchase (\$3.5K): Place orders with any Schedule contractor, but should “rotate” buys.

Micropurchase to Simplified Acq. Threshold (SAT) (\$150K):
Provide RFQ (PWS + Eval Factors + Submittal instructions) to at least three contractors or 8.405-6

Above SAT (\$150K) for Task Order or establishing BPA:
Provide RFQ to as many contractors as practicable*

***For Everybody Now >\$150K, reasonably ensure at least 3 quotes *received* OR use eBuy
8.405-2 (c)(3)**



Blanket Purchase Agreements (BPAs)

- A BPA is a simplified method of filling anticipated repetitive needs for supplies or services by establishing “charge accounts” with qualified sources of supply
- Establishes terms applicable to future orders and does not obligate funds

MAS BPAs

- Simplifies ordering process for repetitive orders
- Considered a competitive procedure
- No guaranteed minimum or maximum
- Permits consolidation of agency and multi-agency requirements
- Eliminates need for immediate funding requirements





Authority for Cooperative Purchasing

The two main authorities for the Cooperative Purchasing program are:

- ❑ Public Law 107-137: Section 211 of the e-Gov Act of 2002, which allows purchase from Schedule 70
- ❑ Public Law 110-248: Local Preparedness Acquisition Act, which allows purchase from Schedule 84





Scope

- State and local (S&L) governments have access to purchase via Schedules 70 and 84, at any time, for any reason, using any funds available- Voluntary Participation
- S&L governments may purchase using grant money or state and local funds under this program

What is Schedule 84?

Schedule 84 - Law Enforcement & Security - provides a variety of equipment and services across the full spectrum of Law Enforcement and Security; including facility protection, covert and overt surveillance, alarm system and all types of duty products and services.

Why is it isolated out for the Cooperative Purchasing Program?

Public Law 110-248 of the Local Preparedness Acquisition Act authorized the cooperative purchasing by state and local governments for economic purchase of equipment and services to better prepare the country for emergency situations

Schedule 84: Marine Craft

- Boats, Engines, Trailers, Spare Parts & Accessories
- Harbor/Waterfront Security Products & Services
- Marine Craft Repair and Modifications to all type Marine Craft
- Professional Consulting and Training Services for Marine Craft, Harbor, or Waterfront
- Floating Marine Barriers, and Booms

Scope of the Disaster Purchasing Program

- ❑ This program authorized state and local governments' access to ALL Federal Supply Schedules, when purchasing to facilitate disaster preparation and response or recovery from major disasters

- ❑ Scope Definitions
 - Preparedness
 - Response
 - Recovery



State and Local Disaster Purchasing Program

Guidelines for State and Local Governments

- Program participation is voluntary
- Must meet all state and local competitive procedures and regulations when purchasing via Schedules
- FEMA Public Assistance Grant Guidance (Disaster Assistance Fact Sheet 9580.103) allows for purchasing from Federal Supply Schedules in support of major disasters



Ordering Guidelines

Mandatory Ordering Language:

This order is placed under GSA Schedule number _____ under the authority of the GSA Disaster Purchasing program. The products and services purchased will be used in preparation or response to disasters or recovery from major disaster declared by the President, or recovery from terrorism or nuclear, biological, chemical, or radiological attack.



Before Disaster Strikes

What contracting vehicles do I have access to purchase from in advance of a disaster?

- ❑ Access to ALL Schedules for the purposes of disaster preparation or response, and recovery from major disasters

- ❑ Schedule BPAs for pre-positioning
 - Selected Schedule contractors in advance and worked out agreements, terms and conditions
 - Promote vendor teaming arrangements
 - Small business concerns

What Is the 1122 Program?

The 1122 Program, authorized under the 1994 Defense Authorization Act and amended by the 2009 National Defense Authorization Act allows:

"...States and units of local government to purchase equipment suitable for counter-drug, homeland security, and emergency response activities through the Department of Defense.

State Point Of Contact (SPOC)

- ❑ The Governor of the state appoints a SPOC
- ❑ The SPOC:
 - Receives all requisitions from state and local entities and ensure availability of funds
 - Determine that the items will be used for counter-drug, homeland security and emergency response activities





SPOC Certification Requirements

What are the Certification Requirements for a SPOC?

1. Current SPOC appointment orders from the Governor.


How Does the Program Work?

- Department of Army or Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) stocked items – to the appropriate supply center
- Commercial items directly with the Multiple Award Schedule Contractor (GSA)

The 1122 Program offers Americans peace of mind by enabling state and units of local government, access to federal sources of supply to purchase equipment in support of counter-drug, homeland security and emergency response activities.

The Duncan Hunter National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2009 amended 10 U.S.C. 381, to expand the procurement authority under the 1122 Program beyond counter-drug activities, to include equipment for homeland security and emergency response activities. Details on the program expansion including the requirements for State Point of Contact (SPOC) certification are located in:
